Required Equipment: Hiking boots, 1-2 quarts of water, snacks, first aid kit, layered clothing, hat and sunscreen.

Recommended Equipment: camera, trekking poles, hat and rain gear if a chance for rain. A radio tuned to channel 6.

Cautions and Special Preparations: There are restrooms and water at the trailhead.

Description: This trailhead features interpretive exhibits about the human history of the Preserve and serves as the major access point to the vast network of trails in the area. It provides access to such unique destinations as Granite Mountain, Cholla Mountain, Brown's Mountain, Balanced Rock and Cathedral Rock. This area was used for ranching from the later 1800s until the mid-1950s. Currently a site for field experiments to determine how best to restore a grazed area, you can find an excellent show of wildflowers in the spring. You can see more by looking for Brown's Ranch Trailhead on Google. There is not much elevation gain on this series of trails. The trails were in excellent condition when the Club did the hike last.

Driving Directions: The Brown's Ranch Trailhead is located in the northern region of the City of Scottsdale's McDowell Sonoran Preserve, approximately 1¼ miles north of the intersection of Alma School Parkway and Dynamite Boulevard. From Loop 101 in Scottsdale, take the Scottsdale Rd exit and head north on Scottsdale Rd to Dynamite Road. Turn right (east) and go to Alma School Pkwy, turn left (north) and drive approximately one mile to the trailhead.
