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Required Equipment: enough water for all day

Recommended Equipment: rain gear, radio, snacks or lunch, camera, trekking poles, layered clothing, moleskin, hat, enough water for all day, sturdy hiking boots.

Cautions and Special Preparations: Should be able to go up Squaw Peak without any difficulties. Higher altitude.

Description: We will meet at the Kendrick Trail Head and follow to the saddle where the old cabin is. I recommend we have lunch there if it is too windy. Once on top of the mountain we can go up the tower if you like. There are breath taking views from there and on a clear day you can make out the Grand Canyon. We will return on the same trail.

Driving Directions: Take I-17 north to Flagstaff. Turn west on I-40 toward Williams and take the Bellemont exit (185) which is 10 miles west of Flagstaff. Go west for one mile on the frontage road (on the north side of the interstate to Forest Road 171). Turn right (north) on Forest Road 171 and go 15 miles to FR 190. Take FR 190 almost 1 mile to the Kendrick Trailhead.

Or alternatively:

From Flagstaff, take Hwy 180 North to FR193, about 12 to 15 miles north turn left on FR193 and continue to FR171. Turn right on FR 171 and go 2 miles to FR190; turn right on FR190 and go 1 mile to the Kendrick trailhead parking area.
