Required Equipment: **Enough water for all day.**

Recommended Equipment: **Snacks, lunch, hat, sunglasses, sunblock, trekking poles, sunblock, camera, first aid kit, two way radio.**

Cautions and Special Preparations: **Should be in good enough shape to hike Camelback without any problems.**

Description: **Everyone is welcome to come and walk through the beautiful groves of aspens and coniferous trees. Go only as far as you desire and then turn around.**

**This is a rolling out and back trail with gradual ups and downs.**

**You will pass by basalt cliffs at 1.5 miles and also have scenic views at some points of the trail. Friedein Prarie is reached just beyond 4 miles. This is a beautiful meadow area with views toward the high mountains. Go another 2 miles on the Kachina Trail to the Weatherford Trail.**

Driving Directions: **: Drive 7 miles northwest of Flagstaff on US 180 and turn north (right) on the Snowbowl Road (FR516). Follow this paved road about 7 miles to the Snowbowl Ski Area. Drive into the first parking lot on the right (south). The Kachina trailhead is located at the south end of the parking lot.**
